### Ye Olde Courthouse/Masonic Hall

Our committee of volunteers at the Courthouse completed several projects over the last two years. In doing so, we moved everything out of our storage room into the Lodge room on the second story including boxes of merchandise for our Junque Sales, our own Christmas decorations, containers and enhancements for our Greens Sale and many boxes of Christmas Junque for our sale in November. Our downstairs closets were overflowing as well as the area next to the jail cell. Our upstairs renovations including a new ceiling in our storage room, a new furnace for the second story, replacing the boarded up window and mis- matched siding on the south gable end and the new steel fire escape on the south end. Junque is now all sold or downstairs and we spent an entire day re-organizing the storage room, cleaning the Lodge room and our closets. The Lodge Room is back to looking like it did in 1910 and we are happy to take our guests upstairs for tours.

We are in the process of organizing our office/Arenac Eastern School Exhibit room and preparing to copy and digitize our historic records as well as the collections at the museum in AuGres. Our future plans include the internet and Ancestry so that we may assist guests with genealogic research. The ACHS received a Pro Active Grant from the Arenac Community Fund in 2020 for preserving these collections. This included records backup, recovery, retention storage and a record retrieval system. The grant consists of a laptop, External LG Ultrafine SK Display, cords, adapters, a trackpad, portable external hard drive, software and two fire proof safes for storage. ACHS Member, Mary Delaat, has been working with this program and in the process of installing it in our office and teaching volunteers to use it. We are looking for volunteers who would like to help with this project.

### **JUNQUE SALE NEWS**

In 2007 the Ye Olde Courthouse committee made a major decision to begin having rummage sales to pay-off its mortgage. We began asking people to donate items toward the effort and soon lots of people began calling us to pick up items they no longer wanted or needed as well as left over items from their yard sales. Because our items were often unique, we came up with our official name for our sales: Ye Olde Courthouse JUNQUE Sales, meaning that many of our items were not only unique but often in excellent/good condition. We picked up donated items from Sanford, Midland, Saginaw, Bay City, West Branch, Standish, Sterling, northeast to Tawas and beyond. The shoreline (Pinconning-Tawas) was particularly fruitful for donations throughout the years. We have made many friends over the past 16 years.

In addition to our *JUNQUE* Sales which often included not only our Courthouse building but often three large outdoor tents, we also conducted a large auction sale because of a generous donor family from AuGres. A unique *Omer Bakers* sale added fine baked goods to our *JUNQUE* sales. We also added used book sales, Holiday Junque sales, Holiday Greens sales. One of the most unique items we ever possessed was a huge mounted Moose head which a gentlemen from AuGres donated and now proudly hangs in a cottage near Tawas. Rosemary who lives in Canton visited one of our early sales and continues to provide many great items year after year from her yard sales to our cause.

But as you all know having a rummage sale is a lot of work. We have traveled as far as the Detroit area with a moving truck and pickup trucks to collect items. Trucks, trailers, procure 1,000+ banana boxes (Jay's Fruit Market), pack them full! Then load them in the trucks/trailers and drive to Omer. Unload them and carry them upstairs to the storage room till the next sale. Then we carry them downstairs to price the items and place on display for the *Junque* sale. Then when the sale is over the leftovers have to be disposed of. . . . some become "Free" on the front porch, others went to local thrift shops and many boxes were transported to the Newberry Senior Center thrift shop in the Upper Peninsula.

But as with all GREAT things-- we are all 16 years older and many are not only "Retired" but also "TIRED." The July 4<sup>th</sup> (June 30-July 1) sale will be our last scheduled *JUNQUE* Sale. We are finding it more difficult to do all the work involved with having sales. We want you "ALL" to know that we certainly have appreciated your support for the Ye Olde Courthouse and "ALL" of you who have contributed and purchased items through the years. It has been rewarding for the Committee members and a lot of fun making and renewing friendships. We are going to miss seeing all of our Courthouse friends.

Because of your generosity between 2007 and 2022, we generated \$156,863.78 in revenue during all our sale efforts. We will continue having the *Christmas Greens* Sale and the *Christmas Junque* Sale, possibly, if we get enough Christmas items donated before November—please start searching your storage areas.!!

## WE WILL CONTINUE TO HAVE BAKE SALES ON HOLIDAY WEEKENDS AND AT CHRISTMAS

Our new maple trees that we planted last year funded partially with a grant from Consumers Energy are doing well. They were planted between our maple trees on the east side that were planted in 1915 by the Masons. We also planted two on the north side of our property. Many thanks to Dick Klender for watering them last year and this year. Mary Daniels killed the weeds growing on our property to the west where we removed the old concrete. We are having black dirt brought in and Mary will plant grass seed. Thanks, Mary.

### **Arenac Community Fund Grant**

The Ye Olde Courthouse was awarded a grant from the Arenac Community Fund in the amount of \$1,875.00 in May for folding chairs. We host many events and programs, our folding chairs are old, and have all been donated to us by various organizations. Many of them were donated by the City of Omer when they tore down their community center. They are metal and very uncomfortable and cold. We are purchasing contoured folding chairs with this grant for the comfort of our guests and ourselves.

We are thankful to the hard working volunteers of the Arenac Community Fund who do so much to provide grants to non-profits in Arenac County.

### Give Local Bay

The Ye Olde Courthouse did very well in this fundraiser to support our endowed fund with the Bay Area Community Foundation. We placed third with \$ 10,250.00. We had \$10,000.00 in gifts, we won a prize for the most donors (70)\$ of \$250.00 and our percent of the incentive pool was \$4,083.00 for a total added to our endowed fund of \$14,333.00. Phyllis prepared a letter which she mailed to individuals, (approximately 150,) notifying them of Give Local Bay and we put flyers in sale bags at our Junque Sale.

We are fortunate to have so many wonderful and generous donors who support the Courthouse. These totals have been amazing every year and we are grateful. This money goes in our Designated Fund to support the Courthouse in the future. We also have an Agency Fund and the George Viele Fund with the Bay Area Community Foundation that also provides income for now and in the future.

Our committee meets on the second Friday of each month at 9:30 at the Courthouse. Volunteers are always needed and welcome to attend.

# Arenac Heritage Route Authority Standish Historical Depot

Our busy summer season is underway at the Depot. Our concerts are held on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30, our Farmers Market takes place on Friday, 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., Fun in the Sun, a sales event for direct sales and crafters is every other Saturday at 10 a.m. and our Vintage Car show is scheduled for July 8<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m. Check our website, <a href="www.standishdepot.org">www.standishdepot.org</a> and our face book page, Standish Historic Depot, for details on our events. Travelers on the U.S. 23 Heritage Route which begins at the Depot and continues to Mackinac City are stopping in daily seeking information on area events, things to see and do in Arenac County and travel in Northeast Michigan. We live here and take our rivers and lakes for granted but people travel from all over the world to view the Great Lakes. Fishing, our canoe liveries and campgrounds bring thousands of people to Arenac County all summer.

### **Digital Sign**

Our digital sign is programmed and displaying non-profit and community events in the area. Our sign sponsors, the Arenac Community Fund, the Standish Downtown Development Authority, the Standish Chamber of Commerce, the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe and our own funds made this sign possible. We advertise our own events and have included programs for the Northeast Michigan Arts Council, the Arenac Community Fund, the Loyalty Day Parade, the Standish Chamber, City of AuGres Music in the Park, Arenac County Fair, the Community Center, the Sunrise Side Antique Tractor Club, Christmas for Kids Golf Outing, Foster Children, Ducks Unlimited, Sterling Sportsmans Club, The Well, Great Start Families and the Veterans Affairs Office. Many thanks to our sponsors and to board member, Wendy Hillman, who chaired and organized this project and continues to put in many hours programming the sign. Our stone columns were completed in June by DeShais Masonry and are a beautiful addition to the sign. Watch for our landscaping which will complete the project.

#### **Gourmet Nut Sale**

Our Gourmet Nut Sale (formerly the Kiwanis Nut Sale) has been a great fundraiser for the Depot. We have a few cans left which can be purchased at Owen Moore Insurance Agency, Whitney's Laundromat, Independent Bank, Turner Bean & Grain, Twining Market, the Arenac County Clerk's office and here at the Depot. These are vacuumed packed and stay fresh for more than a year. They are \$25.00 per 2.25oz. can. They make great hostess gifts and birthday gifts.

### **Give Local Bay**

The Friends of the Arenac Heritage Route Authority, (our non-profit) once again participated in Give Local Bay on May 2<sup>nd</sup> through the Bay Area Community Foundation. This is an opportunity for us to add to our endowed fund to provide for the future of the Depot. Our total in gifts this year was \$4,305.00 and our percent of the incentive pool was \$1,714.95 for a total added to our endowed fund of \$6,019.95! Thanks to all who donated to this worthwhile event.

Bring your lawn chair and enjoy our concerts on Thursday evenings. Our concession stand sells popcorn, pop and water. The Farmers Market on Friday night will continue until September. Volunteers are always welcome to staff the Depot and maintain the grounds.

## Catherine and John Maser Historical Preservation Fund Grant

The Bay Area Community Foundation awarded the Friends of the Arenac Heritage Route Authority a grant from the Catherine and John Maser Historic Preservation Fund in the amount of \$8,178.35 to replace our aging air conditioning unit. Our new air conditioner is an Energy Star Rated American Standard 16 SEER unit. It is estimated that this Energy Star Rated unit will give us an annual savings of 50% over our present unit. The Depot operates on a very tight budget so any savings is greatly appreciated. The Maser Fund, administered by the Bay Area Community Foundation, is for the preservation of historic buildings in Arenac County. This fund has been very helpful to the Depot and the Ye Olde Courthouse in Omer in our efforts to preserve and maintain these Arenac County landmarks.
